



Learning Objectives:

We will introduce the Letter C through our "Letter Basket" We will include items such as cotton, cats, carrots, cans, clowns, caterpillars, cookies, crayons and Corduroy. We will review Letters A and B.

Math:

We will introduce our next number "3". We will continue to review our numbers and practice counting up to 10.

Science:

We will talk about colors and will demonstrate how by mixing 2 different colors you can get a new color. We will demonstrate this through water and food coloring.

Physical Skill Focus:

Gross Motor:

We will practice catching soft balls or bean bags. They will have to toss the bean bags into different size circles that will be taped out on the floor. We will also get some exercise doing crab crawl races.

Fine Motor:

The children will sort coins of various sizes as we continue to discuss small-medium-large.

Cutting Skills will begin this week.

We will start using scissors and will focus on the correct holding of their scissors. We sing a song to help them with this skill. You may enjoy singing it along with them:

Fingers on the bottom- thumbs on top
- that's the way we cut, cut, cut!

We will talk about our next Nursery Rhyme- "Ole King Cole". They will take turns playing out the parts in this nursery rhyme.

Food Craft:

We will be doing a "Candy Collage". The children make their own creations onto graham crackers using frosting along with various types of candy. Extra math will be incorporated by counting and sorting candy by size and color. This craft will be sent home for you to see and you can decide when it should be eaten 😊

Bible Story:

We will discuss the 10 Commandments and how as children they can honor them. We will continue to meet with Pastor Kevin once a week.

Reminders:

Since we have started cutting at school now please continue to practice this skill at home with them. You can give them old newspapers or magazines and just let them cut. This will help develop the strength in their hands.
